
Support is given to Singaporeans and Permanent Residents for costs not supported by other assistance schemes.

Your Gift Matters!

At 48 years old, Lisa* was diagnosed with endometrial^ cancer in 2020. To manage her condition, she underwent surgery at the National University Cancer Institute, Singapore (NCIS) which involved the removal of her uterus, cervix, ovaries and fallopian tubes as well as radiotherapy sessions. Since then, she requires long-term follow-up and surveillance to ensure that her condition does not relapse.

Unfortunately, she experienced a relapse in 2021 and had to undergo tests and further surgery. Lisa is the sole breadwinner of her family. She has to provide full financial support to her school-going son and elderly parents on her single income as an admin worker and is unable to afford the costs of the follow-up tests.

Thanks to the support of donors to the NUHS Fund, Lisa is able to continue receiving the necessary surveillance without financial worries.



Funding amount is decided based on financial assessment by Medical Social workers.




BY CONDITION

Your Gift Matters!

Mikail is 18 years old and suffers from multiple conditions, including spastic- dystonic quadriplegia cerebral palsy (a lifelong severe congenital condition that is characterised by paralysis of both arms and both legs, with muscle stiffness), failure to thrive, swallowing dysfunction and hip dislocation. To manage his growth needs, he requires long term fortified milk formulas.

His father is the main breadwinner of the family but earns a limited income as a freelance barber. Due to his medical condition, Mikail is wheel-chair bound and dependent on his mother for care, and she is only able to work as a part-time mail sorter while juggling his care.

Your generous support has eased the financial strain on Mikail's family and enabled him to receive the necessary milk feeds to increase his weight and meet the optimal weight gain required.
